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Chapter 1

Introduction

Introduction

1 Samuel 16:10-13 NKJV

[10] Thus Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel. And Samuel said to Jesse, "The LORD has not chosen these." [11] And Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all the young men here?" Then he said, "There remains yet the youngest, and there he is, keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him. For we will not sit down till he comes here." [12] So he sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, with bright eyes, and good-looking. And the LORD said, "Arise, anoint him; for this is the one!" [13] Then Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers; and the Spirit of the LORD came upon David from that day forward. So Samuel arose and went to Ramah.

Everyone needs the anointing of God in order to succeed in life and fulfil their destiny. This book looks at the subject of the anointing of God and how it transforms men primarily using the case study of King David.

We will introduce the EIGHT manifestations and TEN dimensions of the anointing that were clear in the life of David.

When we speak of the anointing, we are referring to:

1. Manifestation of the presence of God in a man.
2. Manifestation of the power of God when flowing in a human vessel.
3. Manifestation of the grace of God in His chosen vessels.
4. Manifestation of the gifts of God in life and ministry.

The anointing of God manifests itself as:

1. Oil of Joy Psalm 45:7 - New International Version

You love righteousness and hate wickedness; therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions by anointing you with the oil of joy. Operating in the anointing of God takes away depression, worry and stress in the carrier. Psalm 63:5 - The Passion Translation I overflow with praise when I come before you, for the anointing of your presence satisfies me like nothing else. You are such a rich banquet of pleasure to my soul.

2. Oil of Favour (Esther 2)

And the king loved Esther above all the women, and she obtained grace and favour in his sight more than all the virgins; so that he set the royal crown upon her head, and made her queen instead of Vashti. When Esther was being prepared to appear before the King, she did not just use any type of oil but a special oil of myrrh. This type of oil was used as an ingredient in the holy anointing oil of the Tabernacle. It was used for incense and perfumes.

Concerning David, God declared his favour when he said in [Psalm 89:24]: My faithful love will be with him, and through my name his horn will be exalted. [28] I will maintain my love to him forever, and my covenant with him will never fail.

3.Oil for Healing (Mark 6:12-13)

And they went out and preached that men should repent. And they cast out many devils, and anointed with oil many that were sick, and healed them. Mark 6:12-13

Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him.

James 5:14-15

4.Oil for Cleansing (Psalm 51:10)

When the anointing of the Holy Spirit comes upon a man it causes that person to be cleansed from sin, guilt and iniquity.

Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me (Psalm 51:10)

5.Oil for Harmony/Unity (Psalm 133)

Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity! It is like the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down upon the beard, even Aaron's beard: that went down to the skirts of his garments; Psalm 133:1-2

When the anointing flows from the leader of the congregation, down to the associate minister and among the congregation, there is order in diversity. It is pleasant to see a group of believers operating in one anointing and having the same mind. Without the anointing the natural tendency is for believers to disagree and disintegrate. The anointing brings harmony and unity in families, nations and churches.

6.Oil for Service (Exodus 30:30-32)

Aaron and his sons were anointed to serve in the priesthood ministry. And thou shalt anoint Aaron and his sons, and consecrate them, that they may minister unto me in the priest's office. And thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel, saying, This shall be an holy anointing oil unto me throughout your generations.

7.Oil of Protection and Preservation (Psalm 20:6)

“Now know I that the Lord saveth his anointed...” (Psalm 20:6).

Through the many battles that he fought, David understood that he won not because of his experience in battle or mighty army but because the Lord protected him from those who hated him. The Lord protected him from death, even when he was a few steps to it (1 Samuel 20:3)

8.Oil of Influence (Psalm 89:20)

The anointing of God commands generational influence over the systems we interact with. It will establish you as a man of authority.

For David, it was said that his horn will be exalted (a sign of authority) But my horn shalt thou exalt like the horn of an unicorn: I shall be anointed with fresh oil” (Psalms 92:10).

Psalm 89:20 - Good News Translation

I have made my servant David king by anointing him with holy oil. [89:25]

I will set his hand over the sea, his right hand over the rivers. (David expanded his influence by the anointing)

[27] And I will appoint him to be my firstborn, the most exalted of the kings of the earth.

[29] I will establish his line forever, his throne as long as the heavens endure. The anointing of David also brought influence to his children:

[30] "If his sons forsake my law and do not follow my statutes,

[31] if they violate my decrees and fail to keep my commands,

[32] I will punish their sin with the rod, their iniquity with flogging;

[33] but I will not take my love from him, nor will I ever betray my faithfulness.

[34] I will not violate my covenant or alter what my lips have uttered.

[35] Once for all, I have sworn by my holiness— and I will not lie to David—

[36] that his line will continue forever and his throne endure before me like the sun;

In Old Testament times, the common layman (we'd call him a "believer" today) had no anointing in him or on him. The presence of God was kept shut up in the Holy of Holies in the Temple. But God would anoint the king to stand in that office; He would anoint the priest to stand in that office; and He would anoint the prophet to stand in that office.

The Spirit of God would come upon these three types of individuals to enable them to stand in their respective offices. I Samuel 16:10-13 reports an event organised to anoint the next king of Israel. God sent Samuel in the house of Jesse to anoint the second King of Israel after God rejected Saul. When he arrived there, Jesse lined up all his sons except David.

Samuel does not discern that there is a missing son until the horn refused to pour the anointing. He asked Jesse, "Do you have another son?" That is when Jesse remembered he had another son. He was in the background, but it turned out that God had chosen David for the anointing. No matter how you hidden you may be, when God's time for your life comes, you are brought forward.

Anointing isolated David and brought him to the limelight. He stole the show even though he was not in the day's program. The program coordinator stopped the program until David arrived. When he came in, everybody stood and they ushered him in with a standing ovation. That is what the anointing can do to the anointed!

May God cause you to stand out amid your enemies!

They anointed David as a king, priest, and a prophet. In the 92nd Psalm, David said, "...I shall be anointed with fresh oil" (v. 10). Oil is a type of the Holy Spirit. (Often we need a fresh anointing.)

We live in the day of great opportunity. Because we are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood..(1 Peter 2:9), we carry the priestly, kingly and prophetic anointing. It is no longer reserved to the holy of holies. Everyone can have access to the anointing. The anointing is the release of divine grace and capacity on a human vessel. It is the demonstration of divine power in the lives of men.

David is an example of what happens to a man when he or she operates under the influence of the anointing. When the anointing of God came upon David, his life was not the same. His life experienced a turnaround and transformation.

Chapter 2

What is the

WHAT IS THE ANOINTING FOR TURNAROUND AND TRANSFORMATION?

When we evaluate the life and ministry of King David, we discover that the anointing for turnaround and transformation is an:

1. ANOINTING FOR CAPACITY ENLARGEMENT

The anointing of God in your life increases your capacity to enable you fulfil your destiny. When David was anointed he manifested different capacities. He was a shepherd, musician, poet, warrior, statesman and ultimately the greatest human ruler who would ever reign over Israel. It is possible to manifest different abilities, gifts, talents, ministries because the anointing of God causes what is in you to manifest.

2. ANOINTING FOR BREAKTHROUGH:

The grace and power to receive results in every area of your life. Nobody can enter new dimensions of breakthrough without the manifestation of spiritual unction and grace.

3. ANOINTING FOR WEALTH:

The power to attract resources that you need for destiny fulfilment. These resources are human, financial and spiritual.

The time of David was called the “golden age”. There was a lot of abundance in Israel. David was blessed in silver, gold and all other indicators of wealth.

His net worth calculated with today’s currency would be equated to 200 billion USD (Trillions of Kenya Shillings). This excludes precious items that he owned like gold, ornaments etc.

He personally owned a home specially designed and built from the finest cedar trees (2 Samuel 5:11).

David probably left behind the greatest fortune ever amassed by any one man on planet earth!

4. ANOINTING FOR EXPLOITS:

David did mighty works in his time because he was anointed of God. He started his journey of kingship with the anointing.

JOHN 14:12

12 Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and GREATER WORKS THAN THESE SHALL HE DO; because I go unto my Father.

5. ANOINTING FOR VICTORY

This is the power to prevail/win in the battles of life. In this life, there are many battles, you need the grace to emerge victorious in the battles and the challenges of life.

When David was anointed he won all the battles that he faced in the time of his kingship. He was never injured once in the battles he experienced.

The king was victorious in battle against Moab, Syria, Edom, [the Philistines](#) (on several occasions!), the Geshurites, the Gezrites, the Amalekites, the king of Zobah and others (1 Samuel 27, 2 Samuel 8). He also conquered the city of Jebus, which had resisted becoming an Israelite possession since the time of Joshua, and renamed it Jerusalem (2Samuel 5:6 - 7).

6. ANOINTING FOR INFLUENCE (DOMINION AND TAKEOVER).

This is the capacity to subdue territories and dominate a field. You demonstrate leadership and prominence in your industry and in your field. Anointing forbids smallness. You can never be anointed and not be great.

When David was anointed, he became the best king to ever rule Israel. Even Jerusalem was named the City of David. The grace of God in his life had given him take over, dominion and influence in Jerusalem and the whole of Israel.

The king was victorious in battle against Moab, Syria, Edom, [the Philistines](#) (on several occasions!), the Geshurites, the Gezrites, the Amalekites, the king of Zobah and others (1 Samuel 27, 2 Samuel 8). He also conquered the city of Jebus, which had resisted becoming an Israelite possession since the time of Joshua, and renamed it Jerusalem (2Samuel 5:6 - 7).

People may try to forget and ignore you but when the anointing is on your head, it forbids obscurity. It brings you from the background to the foreground, by fire by force. This is what happened to David:

And Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all the young men here?" Then he said, "There remains yet the youngest, and there he is, keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him. For we will not sit down till he comes here." [12] So he sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, with bright eyes, and good-looking. And the LORD said, "Arise, anoint him; for this is the one!"

7. ANOINTING FOR FAVOUR

a. Favour with people that matter

The anointing of God in a person's life causes him or her to be favoured wherever he or she turns. Because David was anointed, he immediately got favour in the eyes of King Saul. He called him to come and be in his palace all the time so he could serve him. He made him his armour bearer

1 Samuel 16:21-22 KJV

And David came to Saul, and stood before him: and he loved him greatly; and he became his armourbearer. [22] And Saul sent to Jesse, saying, Let David, I pray thee, stand before me; for he hath found favour in my sight.

b. Favour with those you have never met.

1 Samuel 18:1-3

When Saul invited David after killing Goliath, David met the son of Saul called Jonathan and immediately there was a bond between them.

The Bible says that Jonathan loved David as he loved himself (1 Sam 18:3) and he made a pact with David. Although David and Jonathan had never met before, on this day David attracted Jonathan's favour which came to save him many days later as when Saul wanted to kill him, it was Jonathan who made known the plans of his father to David.

By this anointing, may the almighty God connect you with men and women who will secure your life and destiny from the attacks of men and devils.

8. ANOINTING FOR DELIVERANCE

1 Samuel 17:37 KJV

David said moreover, The LORD that delivered me out of the paw of the lion, and out of the paw of the bear, he will deliver me out of the hand of this Philistine. And Saul said unto David, Go, and the LORD be with thee.

a...from the battles of life and destiny (Like in the case of Goliath and other 66 battles that David fought and win.

b...from repeating cycles and patterns (1 Samuel 17:16; Goliath repeated his threats to Saul and his army for forty days, every morning and evening). However, the day that David came under the anointing, that was the last day of shame and reproach to Saul, Israel and to God. This is the last day of shame and whatever makes you feel threatened!

Again, Saul continually and repeatedly wanted to Kill David with the same styles but never succeeded e.g, hurling his spear to David is mentioned twice (1 Samuel 18:11; 19:9-10)

c. From fear and intimidation of the enemy (1 Samuel 17:4-11)

Goliath was big in size, he was a man of war since his youthful days, he had a big mouth with which he used to boast and intimidate Saul and the army of Israel. Every time Goliath would appear, Saul and the army of Israel were terrified and deeply shaken (v.11)

When the anointing came upon David, Saul, who was trying to stop/kill David became afraid of him (1 Samuel 18:12, 15). The Bible says that the more the flow of anointing was upon David, Saul became even more afraid of him. When you walk with God, what you fear begins to fear you and eventually you conquer it!

9. ANNOINTING FOR PRESERVATION

Many times, Saul wanted to harm/kill David. There are times that he even ran away from him. Other times he behaved like a mad man to seek protection. But all in all, God protected David because you can never be wasted when you are walking under the anointing. There are different levels of protection that you experience when you are operating under the anointing. Let us look at some of them taken from the case study of David the King:

a. *Protection from jealousy and envy (1 Samuel 18:6-9)*

When the men were returning home after David had killed the Philistine, the women came out from all the towns of Israel to meet King Saul with singing and dancing, with joyful songs and with timbrels and lyres. [7] As they danced, they sang: “Saul has slain his thousands, and David his tens of thousands.” [8] Saul was very angry; this refrain displeased him greatly. “They have credited David with tens of thousands,” he thought, “but me with only thousands. What more can he get but the kingdom?” [9] And from that time on Saul kept a close eye on David.

Saul was jealous when people began to talk of David’s success. He feared that David would be made king in his place.

Every true success and victory will always attract jealousy and envy from those close to you, however, the Lord protects his anointed from the possible harm that may come out of jealousy and envy.

May God protect you from any eye of jealousy. Never allow jealousy to destroy you. Saul's jealousy for David even caused him to kill 85 priests of the Lord and their families just because Ahimelech the priest had prayed for David (1 Samuel 22).

Deal with Jealousy before it deals with you. Stop being jealous over others, do your work with excellence and with God's help, you will reach your destiny!

Saul remained David's enemy for the rest of his life (1 Samuel 18:29):

When Saul realized that the LORD was with David and that his daughter Michal loved David, Saul became still more afraid of him, and he remained his enemy the rest of his days.

Though he was jealous of him and planned every time how he could kill him, he could do nothing about it. He even died before David. You can never frustrate a man that is walking under the anointing. From today, you will become a man/woman working under the anointing.

b. Protection from planned attacks and the traps of men (1 Samuel 18:11,17)

The next day an evil spirit from God came forcefully on Saul. He was prophesying in his house, while David was playing the lyre, as he usually did. Saul had a spear in his hand [11] and he hurled it, saying to himself, "I'll pin David to the wall." But David eluded him twice.

Saul planned to attack David with a spear and even hurled it to him so he could pin him to the wall, but the Lord protected David.

-Saul promised his daughter to David and sent him to a battle with the Philistines with the hope that the Philistines will kill him. He thought "I'll send him out against the Philistines and let them kill him rather than doing it myself" (1 Samuel 18:17, NLT).

No matter the traps that men may set for you, because you are anointed, their evil plans and traps will not prevail!

Saul tried twice with offering his daughter Merab and Michael to David, but still he failed (1 Samuel 18:17).

Saul planned to assassinate David and sent his servants and his son Jonathan but he could not succeed. Jonathan revealed it to David and asked him to hide (1 Samuel 19:1-7) and the plan was aborted.

When David hid in the wilderness of Zuph, the Bible says in 1 Samuel 23:14, “Saul hunted him day after day, but God did not let Saul find him”. When God hides you, no body can find you!

10. ANNOINTING FOR EXCELLENCE (1 Samuel 18:5)

The anointing of God boosts your capacity for excellence. By the grace of God, i have been able to undertake much responsibility with success.

To mention but a few, i was able to pursue my studies from Diploma to PhD level without having to stop my ministry responsibilities.

In the same period, I was raising a family of four and overseeing some churches. After my graduation, I added more responsibilities to my plate, including county and national government commitments. No one can manage this kind of life unless they are tapping from an uncommon source. I attribute much of my success to the grace of God which causes me to accomplish great feats in the personal, ministry and career life.

Excellence by the anointing is noted:

a. In everything you do.

“Whatever Saul asked David to do, David did it successfully” (1 Samuel 18:5, NLT).

When you excel in what you do, promotion is inevitable. Saul made David a commander over the men of war (1 Samuel 18:6, NLT)

in 1 Samuel 18:14, David continued to succeed in everything that he did, for the Lord was with him (NLT).

He succeeded when he led the troops into battle and all Israel loved him for that (1 Samuel 18:16. 30)

b. ***Inspite of the limitations***

As you read David's story, we discover that:

David was limited by his family background, but he still excelled.

David was limited by age and experience, yet he still excelled beyond his contemporaries.

That is the power behind the anointing in a man's life.

Chapter 3

CHAPTER THREE

WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE ANOINTED?

Anointing of God needs to be activated for it to function in a life. Up to this point, we have examined TEN dimensions of the anointing and how they manifest themselves in the carrier. Now we turn to the prerequisites of the anointing. What does it take to carry the anointing? We will still focus on King David as our primary reference. To be anointed, there is need to:

1. Walk in the Spirit (1 Samuel 23; Psalm 51)

The Spirit of the Lord is the custodian of the anointing. He directs us where to go and how to act when we pray to the Lord with His help. In all the battles that David fought, he enquired of the Lord and God directed him on when to attack and when not to.

We also understand from Psalm 51 that David had the fullness of the Spirit, hence the prayer “Do not take away your Holy Spirit from me”. To be full of the Spirit is to walk under the anointing.

In 1 Samuel 23, David went to save the city of Keilah from the Philistines, when Saul heard it, he decided to come and attack Keilah. David enquired of the Lord and He answered him that Saul would come and that the leaders of Keilah would betray Him, therefore he had to escape again and hid in the wilderness.

2. Walking with the Anointed (1 Samuel 19:18-24)

When David had fled and made his escape, he went to Samuel at Ramah and told him all that Saul had done to him. Then he and Samuel went to Naioth and stayed there. [19] Word came to Saul: “David is in Naioth at Ramah”; [20] so he sent men to capture him. But when they saw a group of prophets prophesying, with Samuel standing there as their leader, the Spirit of God came on Saul’s men, and they also prophesied. [21] Saul was told about it, and he sent more men, and they prophesied too. Saul sent men a third time, and they also prophesied. [22] Finally, he himself left for Ramah and went to the great cistern at Seku. And he asked, “Where are Samuel and David?” “Over in Naioth at Ramah,” they said. [23] So Saul went to Naioth at Ramah. But the Spirit of God came even on him, and he walked along prophesying until he came to Naioth. [24] He stripped off his garments, and he too prophesied in Samuel’s presence. He lay naked all that day and all that night. This is why people say, “Is Saul also among the prophets?”

When things became too tough for David and had to escape, he went and looked for Samuel, the anointed of Lord and Ramah and told him all that Saul was doing to him (1 Samuel 19:18) and Samuel stayed with him.

When Saul understood that David was with Samuel he sent men three times to capture David, but when they got to Ramah, they prophesied.

Saul himself eventually went but even before he reached there, he also prophesied, tore his clothes, lay naked and prophesied all day and night before Samuel.

The anointing upon Samuel and David was too heavy to allow any attack on David.

When you locate the genuine anointed of God assigned to your life (like Samuel was for David), walk with him, interact with him and share with him what you are experiencing. The anointing of God upon his life has the power to cover you from the attacks of the enemy in a mysterious way (1 Samuel 19:18-24).

In 1 Samuel 21, When David's men were famished and had no food to eat while running away, he visited the Lord's anointed, Priest Ahimelech, consulted the Lord (prayed) for him and gave him holy bread for him and his men (1 Samuel 22:9-10). We also note that this consultation to God for David had happened many times as Ahimelech told Saul (1 Samuel 22:15).

God will always place his anointed with a solution to the answers that his people may have.
Relate well with God's anointed set for you.

Even when David had a chance to kill Saul, he only cut a part of his robe but refused to touch the Lord's anointed (1 Samuel 24:6-7).

The other time he took his spear and jar of water when he followed him in the wilderness of Ziph (1 Samuel 26).

According to David, Saul may have been evil and always wanted to finish him, but he was still the Lord's anointed and he would restrain himself till the end.

Eventually Saul blessed David and wished him well and stopped going after him (1 Samuel 27:25). Those who follow after you to harm you, will one day get tired and make peace with you.

In I Samuel 25:1-38, after his time with Saul, David sent some young men to Nabal to assist them with some of his shearing of sheep and some meat from his slaughtered sheep, he was a wealthy man, but the man sent back the young men with David with reckless words. David was so angry that he went with 400 men to kill him but Nabal's wife heard of it and came to meet David with presents and all that David needed, then David went away.

The following day, Nabal had a stroke and lay paralysed on his bed like a stone, About ten days later, the LORD struck him, and he died.

3. Walk in Obedience to God (1 Samuel 31)

1 Samuel 31 records the death of Saul. How could a King who was anointed by God end in defeat and humiliation by the same enemies that he was trying to fight? The answer to this question is simple: Saul refused to walk in obedience to God. He went his way and God said to him, “Obedience is better than sacrifice” in 1 Samuel 13:14.

God had told him to wait for Samuel to sacrifice, but he took the role of Samuel and sacrificed for him.

He ignored God and his anointing and that was the end of his kingdom. He tried everything else but failed. The flow of power, grace and the presence of God dried in him and evil spirits began to torment him. May God help us to retain the flow of anointing in our lives. God help us to walk in Obedience!

4. Anointing with Oil

One of the most controversial areas on the anointing is that of the anointing oil. Many people have abused and misused it.

This book will not go into those controversies but will emphasize on the need to be good stewards of the graces and the tools that God has placed in our hands to activate our faith for the supernatural.

The physical oil is a symbol of the anointing of the Holy Spirit. When used without prayer and the power of the Holy Spirit, it has no effect. But when we receive the anointing of the Spirit with Faith in God, we receive the blessings thereof.

5. Determine to Grow in Power (Ezekiel 47:1-5)

The man brought me back to the entrance to the temple, and I saw water coming out from under the threshold of the temple toward the east (for the temple faced east). The water was coming down from under the south side of the temple, south of the altar. [2] He then brought me out through the north gate and led me around the outside to the outer gate facing east, and the water was trickling from the south side. [3] As the man went eastward with a measuring line in his hand, he measured off a thousand cubits and then led me through water that was ankle-deep. [4] He measured off another thousand cubits and led me through water that was knee-deep. He measured off another thousand and led me through water that was up to the waist. [5] He measured off another thousand, but now it was a river that I could not cross, because the water had risen and was deep enough to swim in—a river that no one could cross.

Prophet Ezekiel paints a picture of growth in dimensions in the power of the Spirit in Ezekiel 47. He moves from ankle, knee, loin, into the great river level of power that is overflowing. Anointing is in dimensions. Depending on whether you will pay the required price, there is no one who cannot be able to grow in the dimensions of power.

Growing in power helps one to experience fresh power and grace to face the challenges that rise with every passing day. The anointing that solved yesterday's challenges cannot solve the ones for today. We need to grow in power so that we can remain in command for the long haul.

This happens as we commit ourselves to consecration, prayers and fasting, and encounter with God privately and corporately in programs designed to build our capacity for exploits.

I was attending an online conference in which Pastor Dr. Paul Eneche of Dunamis Gospel Ministries International said these words, "the more you minister, the more the anointing burns. You need to replenish yourself from time to time so that you can be able to continue ministering without abating in power."

What Dr. Eneche says here is that you cannot continue serving yet fail to grow in power capacity no matter who you are.

During the times when there was a temporary fuel crisis in Kenya in April 2022, a tanker entered into the petrol station and all other cars came cruising behind it thinking that it was ferrying the much awaited fuel. The driver of the tanker said, "I am also looking for fuel just like you, even the tanker needs refueling. What a truth! We all need continuous flow and fullness of the anointing in order to cover more ground in our spiritual journey.

Chapter 4

LET THE ANOINTING FLOW

The anointing of God flows through the fullness of the Spirit. The more we yield to Him on a daily basis, He uses our lives as vessels of glory and honour to bless humanity.

One of the greatest discoveries I have found with the flow of the anointing of the Spirit is that it does not limit you in only one area of gifting.

The Holy Spirit moves you to operate in different gifts and ministries according to the need at hand.

There are times I have operated in the prophetic, spoken in new tongues, worked miracles, evangelised in power, conducted healing and deliverance among many others.

An anointed believer is an arrow in the hands of God, He can shoot you in diverse ministrations as long as you are consecrated as a vessel ready for the Master's use.

Possibilities of the anointing

When God has given us the grace and the flow of His power, we should let it flow so that it can accomplish all the possibilities within it. Some of these include, but are not limited to:

1. Anointing breaks the yoke of stagnation. This happens by the lifting power that is found in the anointing. In Psalm 89:19c, David was exalted by the anointing, thereby causing him to make moves in his life

2. Anointing breaks the yoke satanic conspiracies, chains, and repeating cycles. People meet and take decisions against the Lord's anointed. Their wicked schemes and ideas against your life will amount to nothing because of the anointing. That is why David asked why people even imagine such futile things in Psalm 2:1 "Why do the heathen rage, and the people imagine a vain thing?...against the LORD, and against his anointed..." (Psalms 2:1-2).

3. Anointing breaks the yoke of opposition (Psalm 89: 21): My hand will sustain him; surely my arm will strengthen him. [23] I will crush his foes before him and strike down his adversaries. The enemies that opposed David were defeated because of the anointing upon his life. The anointing is an oil for protection and preservation.

4. Anointing breaks the yoke of oppression. In Psalm 89:22, it was said concerning David that "The enemy will not get the better of him; the wicked will not oppress him"

5. Anointing breaks the yoke of poverty and lack. When David was anointed, he was supernaturally helped (Psalm 89:19b, NASB) [89:26] He will call out to me, 'You are my Father, my God, the Rock my Savior.'
